

TWW Inc. has served over 4,500 students and worked/trained 100 artists.

TWW Inc. has completed its 2015/2016 school year with the Creative Arts Therapy Program. The program was launched this year for the first time, and with some challenges, we had a successful program.

Creative Arts Therapy Brief Description.

Location: Brooklyn's East New York

Creative Art Therapy: Visual Arts

Grades: students k - 5th grade and parents. The Art Therapist worked alongside the Social worker and teaching staff.

7 Groups/8 students per group / 1 group parents and students

Overall: Boys: 47 / Girls: 9

Backgrounds: 60% African American / 20% Hispanic / 20% Caribbean

Students' Challenges: This is an overall list of challenges that the Creative Arts Therapy program was dealing with.

*Behavioral issues (hyperactivity and short attention span)

*Emotional Challenges

*Speech delays

*Developmental delays

*Delay in motor skills

*Developmental delays: speech & cognition

Therapy Projects:

Emotional intelligence, puppet making (who am I), Dream Catcher, Self Portraits, Expressionist art, Sensory activity, The Tree of me, Power of Confidence, How do I feel today, Drawing out your emotions, Self Esteem, Building my Confidence, and having personal diaries.

End Results

Students were able to better control their emotional challenges, and other developmental skills were strengthened. Art work was displayed for the school, and students did a small presentation. Parents and school staff had a better understanding of the challenges students deal with, and was very supportive by offering their help.
